A visible learner is a student who:

- Can be their own teacher
- Can articulate what they are learning and why
- Can talk about how they are learning and why
- Can talk about how they are learning – the strategies they are using to learn
- Can articulate their next steps
- Can use self-regulation strategies
- Is assessment capable – understands the tools being used and what their results mean and can self-assess to answer key questions: 'Where am I in my learning?' 'Where am I going?' and 'What do I need to do to get there?'
- Seeks, is resilient to and aspires to challenge
- Can set mastery goals
- Sees errors as opportunities and is comfortable saying that they don't know or need help
- Positively supports their peers learning
- Knows what to do when they don't know what to do.
- Actively seeks feedback
