### Cyber Safety Presentation Reminder

We would like to remind parents/ caregivers that on Monday 16<sup>th</sup> September the Year 3 to Year 7 classes will be attending a cyber safety presentation by 2 local police officers.

The Year 3 and Year 4 students will learn about how the internet is used, why unidentifiable usernames and passwords are essential to maintaining privacy and security and why adult supervision and permission is important before signing up to apps and websites.

The Year 5 – 6 students will learn about concepts of technology and online safety.

Further to this, students will learn about true and false information, safe searching and staying safe while using instant messaging and the dangers of sharing images or videos, as well as information being made available for students to support them to stay safe online.



# Physical Education Report

Becoming a PE specialist Teacher this year has highlighted the importance of the three main curriculum areas of:

- Moving our body
- Understanding movement
- Learning through movement.

These three main areas concentrate on skills, movement sequences, positive participation, strategies of working in groups, problem solving, understanding rules, fair play, community connections, cultural games, feedback and social skills.

By concentrating on these, I have learnt so much about the Health Curriculum but most importantly about the children in this school. Setting a Learning goal and Success criteria that we discuss and revisit at the end of lessons, the students are able to leave the gym with confidence about the new skills we have learnt. I have encouraged them by taking more leadership in lessons. Students will put their hand up to run a warm up and stretches for the class. They will share their knowledge of a skill and show the class. Many students set a PE goal at the beginning of the year and we will revisit this at the end of the year to see if they achieved it and think about one for the following year.

I have thoroughly enjoyed the challenge of teaching Physical Education this year. I have had to learn many new skills like the Sporting School Program, SAPSASA events, Sport Day, Lightning Carnival and organising other specialists to come and visit our school. A huge thank you to Liz Murphy who has mentored me this year and helped me with many things.

## SAKG BBQ Fundraiser

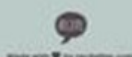


On Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> October Littlehampton Primary School is hosting a BBQ fundraiser at Bunnings Mount Barker
